Coffs Council Environmental Levy Volunteer Support Project 2017/18

- 53 new members joined CHRL
- 152 people attended various training events
- On-ground bush regeneration support to the value of \$ 93,264 completed
- \$ 8,100 spent on trainers
- \$ 942 spent on materials for Indian Myna control
- Over 250 Indian Mynas caught and destroyed
- 6317 plants distributed by CHRL Community Nursery
- \$12,468 for tools, PPE & equipment
- CHRL added \$ **680,342** value to the CHCC investment of \$180,000 Environmental Levy Grant. For every \$1 EL, we attracted another \$**3.78** (includes volunteer hours, other paid hrs & grants)

Volunteer Hours 2017-18

- Log Books received so far show that CHRL volunteers contributed 11,000 hours last financial year
- Value of work: \$444,620 (@\$40.42/hour)

Council Environmental Levy Project 2018/19 – 2020/2021

- After the Council reviewed this funding program and called for applications, *Coffs Harbour Regional Landcare* and *Orara Rivercare Association* were successful in achieving a three year funding commitment in the *Major Strategic Programs* stream of the Levy.
- This means that CHRL will receive funding for volunteer support to 30 June 2021, provided that we report on time and expend our funds by end of June each year.



New Concept: “Blitz Working Bees”

A ‘Weed Blitz’ was organised when Park Beach Dunecare Group asked for help with controlling Turkey Rhubarb. A call out was made to all CHRL members for help. 21 members attended the Blitz digging up these tubers and making a significant impact at this site.




- 3 Blueberry growers engaged in 17/18 project

- Over 250 birds trapped
- Numbers of recorded trapped birds reduced from last year, probably due to insufficient reporting
- Funding through CHCC EL
- Currently 3 trapping coordinators: Ron Smith, Greg Robinson, Leah Sjoberg
